## **TECHNICAL INFORMATION**

**Background:** DCAF's initial assessment, based on discussions with CSO and Media representatives in North Macedonia, is that there is a need to increase capacities and knowledge on topics addressed within the DCAF Programme, so that local CSOs and Media can engage more effectively the public in studying, discussing and better understanding the need for improved security and intelligence governance and accountability in North Macedonia, and progress required in this area in North Macedonia. During 2022, two basic trainings were conducted by DCAF on Intelligence and Security Governance. In addition, a subsequent focus groups needs assessment proved the necessity of additional trainings focused on in-depth topics related to security sector governance and accountability.

Training No. 3, In-depth topic 1: Human Rights Mainstreaming in Security Sector Reform

## Objectives of the Training No. 3:

- Enhance the knowledge and understanding of representatives of the local CSOs and Media organizations on Human Rights-Based Approach to Security Sector Reform.
- Equip the local CSOs and Media with know-how for promoting a rights-based and gender-responsive SSR processes.
- Stimulate discussion about the role of CSOs and Media in monitoring the observance of human rights obligations of the intelligence and security sector in North Macedonia.
- Empower the local CSOs and Media on how to contribute to better-informed public debate on the ongoing intel and security reforms.
