# **Endicott Global Education Conference:**

### International Security, Justice, and Civil Engagement Talk | April 21-24

The Endicott Global Education Conference: International Security, Justice, Civil Engagement Talks among Endicott International Partners will address pressing global challenges, including human and fentanyl trafficking from Latin America to the U.S., weapon trafficking, organized crime, and security concerns in Ukraine's post-war context, as well as the evolving landscape of cybercrime.

The conference will convene approximately 21 delegates representing 16 countries from Latin America and Eastern Europe. Participating countries include Albania, Argentina, Bulgaria, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Croatia, Honduras, Kosovo, North Macedonia, Panama, Romania, Serbia, South Korea, Uruguay, and the United States. (Please note that the conference is by invitation only due to requests from some panelists concerning the sensitive nature of their presentations.)

Key representatives from U.S. federal law enforcement agencies—including HSI, DEA, and FBI—will also participate, fostering discussions on international collaboration in tackling these critical security threats.

Co-sponsored by the Cybercrime Forensic Lab, the Center for Civic Engagement, and the Global Education Office at Endicott College, this event aims to facilitate cross-regional dialogue and foster strategic partnerships on issues related to justice and security. The Center for Civic Engagement and the Global Education Office will co-sponsor hosted dinners on April 21 and April 22, while the Homeland Security Program at Endicott College will sponsor the hosted dinner on April 24.

This conference serves as a vital forum for advancing global cooperation on security and justice, strengthening civic engagement, and promoting international education.




