# Principles of Effective Testing

- ▶ Validity: measures what it should
- ▶ Reliability: consistent results
- ▶ Fairness: avoids cultural bias
- ▶ Practicality: feasible in classrooms

# Techniques of Language Testing

- ▶ Traditional paper-based tests
- ▶ Performance-based tasks (writing, interviews, presentations)
- ▶ Standardized tests (TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge)
- ▶ Technology-enhanced testing (adaptive, AI-driven)

- ▶ Over-reliance on routine testing
- ▶ Validity vs practicality tensions
- ▶ Technology disparities
